#### **Organization Overview**

Florida Outreach Center for the Blind (FOCB), established in 2003, empowers blind and visually impaired individuals in Palm Beach County to lead independent, fulfilling lives. Through free programs in Braille, assistive technology, daily living skills, and personal development, FOCB fosters confidence, self-sufficiency, and community connection. Its mission is to integrate individuals into the social, economic, and spiritual life of the community—creating lasting impact through education, support, and opportunity.

#### **Funding Impact**

Through its first year of support, Quantum Foundation's funding empowered FOCB clients to build confidence, independence, and essential life skills—surpassing program goals and strengthening their ability to navigate daily life with greater ease and autonomy.

Outcomes to date:



**61** of 69 clients demonstrated **improved mobility skills and increased confidence** navigating safely at home and in the community, more than doubling the original goal of serving 30 clients.



**239** unduplicated clients participated in Adaptive Technology Training, exceeding the original goal of 90. Of those served, **97% reported increased knowledge** and ability to use adaptive technology, including smartphones, tablets, screen readers, and computers.



**85%** of the 59 clients who participated in Independent Living Skills Training demonstrated an assessed **increase in their ability and confidence in performing daily living activities**, exceeding the original service goal by 18%.



# **Highlights**

The Stronger Together Doula Support program recently celebrated the graduation of Cohort 3 with nine doulas, who began the program in 2023, completing full certification. Collectively, they were matched with 30 pregnant moms, providing essential support throughout pregnancy and delivery. Of those, 20 moms delivered successfully, while others withdrew from the program or suffered loss.

The program continues to grow and thrive:

- **Cohort 4** is currently active with 20 doulas, already matched with 38 pregnant moms.
- Cohort 5 has launched with 14 doulas and will begin the matching process soon.
- **Cohort 6** began on March 14, welcoming 21 doulas. This cohort is comprised of Black and Haitian women. Once matching begins, they will be paired with clients from their own communities supporting a model of care that is both culturally responsive and rooted in shared lived experience.

The continued success of the Stronger Together program highlights its deep commitment to advancing equitable, culturally aligned care across communities.


#### **LIFT JAX Visit**
