Organization Overview

The Boynton Beach Faith Based Community Development Corporation (CDC), founded in 1999, is committed to fostering sustainable communities and improving the quality of life for low-income residents in Boynton Beach. With a mission centered on homeownership, strategic partnerships, and delivering essential social services, the organization works to build a healthy, thriving community.

The Elder Care Program provides seniors with nutritious meals, wellness checks, housing support, transportation, and engaging social and educational activities—all aimed at reducing food insecurity and isolation, and helping seniors age in place safely and independently.

Funding Impact

The \$51,797 grant from Quantum Foundation enabled CDC to exceed its goals in supporting seniors with critical services that promoted aging in place. Their efforts significantly reduced food insecurity and social isolation, improving overall well-being and quality of life for 244 seniors living in the heart of Boynton Beach.



98% of 244 seniors remained independent and in their homes, avoiding institutional care.



161 seniors participated in at least one or more of the 28 social events including cultural celebrations, field trips, and arts activities, alongside six educational presentations on health and aging.



Delivered over **8,101** healthy meals, distributed **4,726** grocery bags, and **2,670** lbs of fresh produce.

Program: Youth Sickling Through Life

Organization Overview

The Sickle Cell Foundation of Palm Beach County & Treasure Coast, founded in 1973, is a nonprofit dedicated to supporting individuals affected by sickle cell disease through education, advocacy, and community-based services. Its flagship Youth Sickling Through Life program equips young people with the knowledge, confidence, and tools to manage their health through workshops on disease management, mental wellness, nutrition, and transition to adult care.

Funding Impact

With support from Quantum Foundation's \$56,984 grant, the Youth Sickling Through Life program has empowered youth and families living with sickle cell disease through targeted workshops on disease management, nutrition, and communication—effectively strengthening mental health and self-management skills among participants.

Outcomes to date:

90%

of participants that completed disease management workshops **increased confidence** in medication adherence, symptom recognition, and knowing when to seek medical help.



90% of participants of the nutrition and communication workshops reported healthier eating habits and **75%** expressed greater confidence in communicating their needs to healthcare providers and family members.



80% of participants showed improved understanding of disease and long-term care management.



On April 23, Quantum Foundation launched its series of Capacity Building workshops with **“Grant Writing 101: How to Find and Win Your First Grants,”** hosted at Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies Coalition of Palm Beach County.

The workshop welcomed 40 participants from small nonprofit organizations for a hands-on session focused on crafting compelling proposals, building strong funder relationships, and securing critical funding. By enhancing storytelling and grant development skills, the session aimed to strengthen nonprofit capacity and broaden community impact across Palm Beach County.
