Organization Overview

Since 2001, Quantum House has been a place *"Where Hope Has a Home®,"* providing comfort, care, and housing for families with children receiving serious medical treatment in Palm Beach County. Located on the campus of St. Mary's Medical Center, it is the only facility of its kind between Orlando and Miami.

With a mission to ease the burdens families face during medical crises, Quantum House offers free lodging, meals, and support services, allowing caregivers to focus entirely on their child's healing.

Funding Impact

Over the past six months, Quantum Foundation's \$25,000 grant has played a critical role in removing barriers to care for families facing pediatric medical crises. By easing financial and logistical burdens, the support ensured **190 families** could remain close to their child during treatment—fostering stability, reducing stress, and improving overall health outcomes during an incredibly challenging time.





Empowering Futures: A Year of Impact with Ladies of Futurity

This past year, Ladies of Futurity continued to rise as a beacon of support, empowerment, and transformation for teen girls in our community. Rooted in its mission to provide teen girls with the tools, resources, and support needed to lead healthy, confident, and successful lives, the organization remained steadfast in its commitment to nurturing the next generation.

More than just programs, Project F.I.T. and Project Trunks for Success were acts of care and empowerment, meeting immediate needs while building confidence, resilience, and readiness for the future.

Through funding from **Quantum In The Community**:



Project F.I.T. reached 75 girls through a full-day Health & Wellness Symposium featuring expert-led sessions on self-care, mental health, and body image. Participants received meals, care packages, and educational materials to support their well-being.



Project Trunks for Success equipped four college-bound girls with fully stocked dorm trunks—including laptops, bedding, and school supplies—helping ease the financial burden of transitioning to college life.



Center for Child Counseling Mobile Unit Tour



Members of the Venture team visited the Center for Child Counseling (CCC) to tour their mobile unit, which brings mental health services directly to communities where children and families need them most. During the visit, PBVP also gained insight into the geo-mapping system CCC uses to identify areas of greatest need and strategically deploy mental health resources across the county.

RISE Coleman Park

The Director of Community for RISE Coleman Park, Ontario “OJ” Johnson, along with a group of residents, visited Northside Development Group—a fellow Purpose Built Community in Spartanburg, South Carolina. During the trip, Coleman Park residents met with the “Northside Voyagers,” a group of resident leaders from the Spartanburg community. Together, they discussed approaches to community leadership, shared experiences on building resident-led initiatives, and explored how Coleman Park residents can begin stepping into leadership roles to help shape their own neighborhood’s future.





Placemaking Project: 2003 N. Tamarind Avenue



With the recent usage rights granted by the City of West Palm Beach for 2003 N. Tamarind Avenue, the PBVP team is moving forward in partnership with Rise Coleman Park with plans to open and program the space for Coleman Park residents by this fall.

The existing building on the property has been primed by a neighborhood painting business, and an artist has been contracted to develop a mural design for the exterior. In coordination with Rise Coleman Park, residents will have the opportunity to vote on their preferred design through a month-long survey, ensuring that community voice and vision are central to the project.

At the same time, PBVP is working with an architectural firm to develop site plans for city permitting and is coordinating landscaping improvements to help shape the space in alignment with community priorities.
