Organization Overview

Established in 1994, the Center for Creative Education (CCE) is dedicated to transforming teaching and learning through creativity and the arts, helping students build the confidence to meet life's challenges and opportunities.

CCE's Social Worker offers individualized support to students and families, addressing issues like absenteeism, housing, and access to basic needs. Through close collaboration with teachers, families, and community partners, they help create a safe, nurturing environment that supports student well-being and academic success.

Funding Impact

The \$80,000 grant from the Quantum Foundation is helping the Center for Creative Education strengthen its integrated social services by funding dedicated staff who address non-academic barriers to student success. Through this support, students and families are gaining greater access to community resources, along with the tools they need to thrive academically, emotionally, and beyond.

In the first six months of the grant period:



100% of 15 community resource partners (including housing, utilities, and counseling services) helped expand access to vital supports for CCE families.



76 students and families in need were connected with community partners—exceeding the original goal of 45—with **85%** reporting improved access to resources and feeling more supported.



90% of 50 students and families who received targeted support interventions demonstrated growth in socio-emotional learning, academic skills, motivation, and communication.

The First 100 Babies

In 2021, we launched the Stronger Together Doula Support program.

In 2022, the first baby was born with the support of an HMHB trained doula.

Today, we celebrate 100 babies born with Stronger Together!

All of these births were supported by <u>Stronger Together Doulas</u> – 104 women in total have been trained to date.

Plan. Prepare. Protect.

Rhonda's Promise, Inc., a Quantum in the Community grantee partner, continues to empower residents across Palm Beach County through meaningful, community-based efforts.

With support from the Quantum Foundation and FPL, and in collaboration with various community partners, the organization recently hosted a series of **Hurricane Preparedness Workshops** that addressed both emergency planning and emotional wellness during storm season.

Each workshop guided participants in creating personalized evacuation and safety plans while also helping them navigate the emotional stress that storms can bring. Facilitated by staff from emergency management and local community advocates, the sessions offered trusted information and hands-on support. Every attendee received a fully stocked hurricane essentials backpack, equipping them with the tools they need to feel informed, supported, and ready.

These workshops are a powerful example of how grassroots collaboration can drive real impact. By uniting expertise, resources, and care, *Rhonda's Promise* is ensuring that our most vulnerable neighbors are not only prepared—but also empowered.





Property Acquisition





1813 N Tamarind Avenue was recently acquired, and the PBVP team, together with RISE Coleman Park and other community partners, is developing a collaborative plan to engage the youth who frequently gather near the store. The goal is to connect them with meaningful resources, including job opportunities and support services.

Landscaping

Throughout improvements lune, continued at key intersections along **Tamarind** focusing Avenue, on landscaping enhancements. Landscaping and irrigation systems were restored at the corner of 20th Street and Tamarind Avenue, with additional upgrades planned for several other planting beds across the neighborhood in the coming months.











Matter of Fact with Soledad O'Brien





The Matter of Fact segment *Protecting a Florida Community from Gentrification* aired in June and highlighted the impactful work of the Quantum Foundation, PBVP, and RISE Coleman Park. The feature also included an interview with legacy resident Ms. Nellie Cooper, who shared what Coleman Park means to her and her community. The segment reached an estimated audience of 2.4 million impressions, significantly expanding PBVP's national visibility and elevating awareness of the local work being done in West Palm Beach.
